BOWLING GREEN MAN INDICTED ON METHAMPHETAMINE CHARGES

David L. Huber, United States Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky, announced today that a federal Grand Jury in Bowling Green, **returned an Indictment** charging **KEVIN BRIAN BRAY**, age 39, of 1281 Whitestone Quarry Road, Bowling Green, Kentucky, with attempting and conspiring to manufacture more than 50 grams of methamphetamine, and with possessing equipment, chemicals and pseudoephedrine to manufacture methamphetamine.

The Indictment charges that on or about October 4, 2006, **Bray** attempted to manufacture 50 grams or more of methamphetamine, conspired with others to manufacture 50 grams or more of methamphetamine, possessed pseudoephedrine having reason to believe it would be used to manufacture methamphetamine, and possessed equipment and chemicals having reason to believe they would be used to manufacture methamphetamine. According to the Indictment, these offenses took place in Warren County, Kentucky.

If convicted, the maximum potential penalties are life imprisonment, a \$16,500,000 fine, and supervised release for a period of no less than ten years and up to life.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney John E. Kuhn, Jr., and it was investigated by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), and the Bowling Green Police Department.

Bray is scheduled to appear for arraignment before the United States Magistrate Judge on January 24, 2007, at 10:00 am, in Bowling Green, Kentucky.
