PROJECT SAFE NEIGHBORHOODS

NASHUA MAN SENTENCED ON CHARGES OF BEING A FELON IN POSSESSION OF A FIREARM AND POSSESSION WITH INTENT TO DISTRIBUTE MORE THAN 50 GRAMS OF CRACK COCAINE

CONCORD, NEW HAMPSHIRE: Alexis Diaz, 23, of Nashua, was sentenced on one count of being a Felon in Possession of a Firearm and one count of Possession with Intent to Distribute more than 50 grams of Crack Cocaine. The Court imposed a term of imprisonment of 120 months. Upon his release, Diaz will be placed on supervised release for five years.

U.S. District Court Judge Paul Barbadoro ruled that the sentence imposed was necessary to reflect the seriousness of the offenses committed and the criminal history of the defendant.

Project Safe Neighborhoods is a federal program to reduce gun violence in New Hampshire by aggressive investigation and prosecution of firearm offenders, education of the public and training of law enforcement officers about federal firearm laws.
