BOWLING GREEN MAN INDICTED FOR FEDERAL NARCOTICS VIOLATIONS

– Bowling Green man charged with possession with intent to distribute crack cocaine

BOWLING GREEN, KY - A federal grand jury in Bowling Green returned an indictment on December 5, 2007, against **Frederick Earl Williams, Jr.**, age 41, of Horse Cave, Kentucky, on one count that he knowingly and intentionally possessed with intent to distribute five grams or more of crack cocaine, U.S. Attorney , David L. Huber, United States Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky, and Paul Vido, Special Agent in Charge of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), Bowling Green Field Division, jointly announced today.

The Indictment alleges that on September 17, 2007 Williams was in possession of more than 5 grams of crack cocaine with the intent to distribute, with a street value of at least \$500.

In the event of a conviction, the maximum potential penalties are 40 years, a \$2,000,000.00 fine, and supervised release for a period of 4 years; and the minimum potential penalties are 5 years imprisonment.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Mac Shannon. The Bowling Green Field Office of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) conducted the investigation as part of ATF's mandated mission to reduce violent crime and other threats to public safety.

Defendant, Brewer is scheduled to appear for arraignment before the United States Magistrate Judge on December 19, at 9:30 a.m., in Bowling Green, Kentucky.
