**BOWLING GREEN MAN SENTENCED TWO YEARS AND NINE MONTHS FOR
SELLING POWDER COCAINE, CRACK COCAINE AND A SAWED-OFF SHOTGUN**

*- Multiple purchases of powder cocaine led to purchase
of crack cocaine and an illegal sawed-off shotgun*

BOWLING GREEN, KY - Zedric Drawhorn, age 22, of 557 Top Miller, Bowling Green, Kentucky, in Warren County, was sentenced to 2 years and 9 months imprisonment in United States District Court, Bowling Green, distributing cocaine and cocaine base, and transferring an illegal short barreled shotgun to another person, U.S. Attorney David L. Huber of the Western District of Kentucky, and Paul Vido, Special Agent in Charge of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), Louisville Field Division, jointly announced today. Thomas B. Russell, Judge, United States District Court, also sentenced Drawhorn to 3 years supervised release following incarceration. There is no parole in the federal judicial system.

During his guilty plea, Drawhorn admitted that on September 27, September 29, and October 2, 2006, he sold cocaine to an informant in Warren County, Kentucky. The amounts of cocaine sold by Drawhorn on those occasions were 3.48 grams, 7.93 grams, and 4.27 grams respectively. Later, on November 22, 2006, in Warren County, Kentucky, Drawhorn sold an informant 3.74 grams of crack cocaine and an illegal Savage Arms, Revelation model 12-gauge short barreled shotgun, bearing serial number C343798. Federal law requires that any rifle or shotgun with a barrel length of less than 18 inches and an overall length of less than 26 inches must be registered in the National Firearms Registration and Transfer Record, and the transfer of

any such firearm must be reported to and approved by ATF.

The street value of the cocaine and cocaine base sold by Drawhorn was \$1,400.00.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Thomas W. Dyke. The Bowling Green Field Office of ATF conducted the investigation in partnership with the Warren County Drug Task Force, as part of ATF's mission to reduce violent crime and other threats to public safety.
