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**LEBANON DRUG DEALER SENTENCED TO TEN YEARS
FOR DEALING CRACK COCAINE**

- Previously convicted felon had cocaine with street value approximately \$7,000

LOUISVILLE, KY - Jeremy Seabrooks, age 31, of Lebanon, Kentucky, in Marion County, was sentenced to 10 years imprisonment in United States District Court, Louisville, Kentucky, for selling cocaine, U.S. Attorney David L. Huber of the Western District of Kentucky, and Paul Vido, Special Agent in Charge of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), Louisville Field Division, jointly announced today. Joseph H. McKinley, Jr., Judge, United States District Court, also sentenced Seabrooks to 5 years supervised release following incarceration. **There is no parole in the federal judicial system.**

Seabrooks had plead guilty on May 14, 2008 to a four-Count Indictment charging him with distributing and selling approximately 70 grams of crack cocaine between December, 2006 and January, 2007. On December 8, 2006, he sold a confidential informant 3.6 grams of crack cocaine; on December 13, 2006, he sold a confidential informant purchased 11.4 grams of crack cocaine; on December 15, 2006, he sold a confidential informant 52.8 grams of crack cocaine; and on January 17, 2007, he sold a confidential informant purchased 2.6 grams of crack cocaine. All of the drug deals occurred in Marion County, Kentucky. The approximate street value of the 70 grams of crack cocaine is \$7,000.

Seabrooks had been convicted in Marion Circuit Court in 1999 for trafficking in cocaine.

He had been released from prison in July, 2005, approximately seventeen months before committing the offenses for which he was convicted in this federal case.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney John E. Kuhn, Jr. The investigation was conducted primarily by the Kentucky State Police in partnership with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), as part of ATF's mandated mission to reduce violent crime and other threats to public safety.

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
