## **UNITED STATES ATTORNEY REPORTS WEEKLY RESULTS OF ST. LOUIS REGIONAL CEASEFIRE INITIATIVE**

St. Louis, Missouri: The following represents the prosecution activities under the St. Louis Regional Ceasefire Initiative, a component of the Bush Administration's Project Safe Neighborhoods Program, United States Attorney Catherine L. Hanaway announced today.

These cases are the result of the collaborative efforts of federal and local law enforcement including the U.S. Attorney's Office, the St. Louis City Circuit Attorney's Office, the St. Louis County Prosecutor's Office, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), the U.S. Marshal's Service, the Drug Enforcement Administration, the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department and the St. Louis County Police Department.

This week's results of Project Safe Neighborhood/Ceasefire are as follows:

### **UNITED STATES ATTORNEY'S OFFICE**

TERRY PARKER, 30, of the 5100 block of Campfire Trial, St. Louis, 63033, was sentenced to 57 months in prison on one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm.

KENDRICK WAGNER, 32, of the 3400 block of Oregon, St. Louis, 63118, was sentenced to 41 months in prison on one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm.

ASHLEY JARROD SATCHELL, 22, of the 4000 block of Russell, St. Louis, 63110, was sentenced to 18 months in prison on one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm.

JAMELL A. BURNETT, 28, of the 300 block of Christian, St. Louis, was sentenced to 10 months in prison on one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm.

FREDERICK TOWNSEND, 22, of the 3900 block of Michigan, St. Louis, 63118, pled guilty to one felony count of conspiracy to possess a firearm by a convicted felon. Townsend now faces a maximum penalty of five years in prison and/or a fine of \$250,000. Sentencing has been set for January 13, 2005.

DARION LAMONT MITCHELL, 28, of the 1300 block of Pendleton, St. Louis, 63113, pled guilty to one felony count of being a previously convicted felon in possession of a firearm. Mitchell now faces a maximum penalty of ten years in prison and/or a fine of \$250,000. Sentencing has been set for January 13, 2006.
